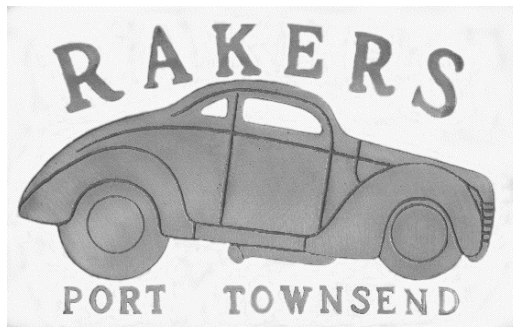


CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF RAKERS CAR CLUB

Article 1: NAME AND EMBLEM

Section 1. The name of the organization shall be:
RAKERS.

Section 2. The emblem shall be:



Article 2: OBJECTIVES

Section 1. As this organization is largely automotive in nature, it shall foster safety and good fellowship in all such events.

Section 2. To conduct club functions and activities in a manner befitting members of the street rodding sport and to encourage a better understanding of street rodding as a constructive sport among members of the public, press and law enforcement agencies.

Article 3: GOVERNMENT

The government of the club shall be exercised by a majority vote of the members present in a regular meeting, except as may otherwise be stated in these By-Laws. Meetings will be conducted according to Robert's Rules of Order.

Article 4: MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Any person at least 19 years of age is eligible for Active membership in this Club

Section 2. Applicants for Active or Associate Membership must:

- A. Have a valid drivers license unless handicapped. Spouse and/or significant other are exempt from this requirement.
- B. All Active and Associate members (except spouses and/or significant others) must maintain a valid driver license in order to be eligible for continued membership.
- C. Have a minimum of liability and property damage insurance as required by the State Of Washington.

Section 3. There shall be two classes of membership of this Club: (A) Active, and (B) Associate Member.

- A. Active members shall include the Applicant and his/her Spouse or Domestic Partner, each of whom shall be members and entitled to a membership vote.
- B. Associate member shall include dependants of Full Members between the ages of 16 through 18. Associate members must meet qualifications set forth in Article 4, Section 2, A& B. Associate membership requires the parent or guardian's Active membership in this Club.
- C. Associate members shall have the same rights and privileges as Active members.
- D. All Active and Associate members shall have the sole right to vote at all meetings.

Article 5: APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. All applications for membership shall be made on the Club application form and be signed by one Active member.
- Section 2. Applications for membership shall be read at a regular meeting with applicant in attendance. Upon vote of a majority of the members present, the applicant will be admitted to membership.
- Section 3. Before any action may be taken by the membership upon the application, and before any rights of membership may accrue, the applicant must submit the required initiation and dues.
- Section 4. Requirement for the applicant's attendance may be waived by majority vote of members present at the meeting.

Article 6: INITIATION /DUES

- Section 1. Annual Membership dues shall be due on June 1 of each year. Payments for dues in arrears will be accepted until August 1. A penalty payment of \$10 will be assessed for those dues paid after the regular meeting in July. After August 1, members will automatically be dropped from membership for non-payment of dues.
- Section 2. All membership dues shall be payable annually in advance.
- Section 3. As of August 1, 2001, initial initiation will be paid in an amount of \$20 and is to be included with the application for Active membership and dues.
- Section 4. Associate members will not be required to pay initiation fees.
- Section 5. Initial dues for Active Members shall be \$25 per year.
- Section 6. Initial dues for Associate Member shall be \$15 per year.
- Section 7. Initiation and Dues shall be set by majority vote at the regular meeting in April of each year. This does not restrict changes voted by majority of members present at a regular meeting for dues and initiation fees.

Section 8. Applications for membership after June 1 of each year shall have dues pro-rated on a quarterly basis.

Article 7: OFFICERS

Section 1. The elective officers of this Club shall consist of: President, Vice President, Secretary/ Treasurer, and two Trustees, elected from the membership. The terms of office for all officers except Trustees, shall be for one year.

Section 2. Initially, two Trustees shall be elected, one having a one year term of office and the other having a two year term of office. Thereafter, Trustees shall be elected for a period of two years, but only one Trustee shall be elected in any one year. Nothing herein shall prevent the election of a Trustee for the purpose of filling a vacancy at any time.

Section 3. The elective officers, with the immediate Past President, shall constitute the Board of Trustees of this Club and shall meet at least once a month and at such other times as the President may direct, or upon the request to the President by any two members there-of. Each member of the Board shall receive such notice of every meeting as the Board shall direct following annual election.

Section 4. The Board of Trustees shall have the active business management and control of the affairs and funds of the Club.

Section 5. No officer of this Club shall receive any remuneration for services except as herein specifically provided.

Section 6. The annual meeting for the election of officers shall be held on the regular meeting night in May of each year.

Section 7. Vote will be taken by majority vote of members present.

Article 8: QUORUM

Section 1. One elected officer and ten active members shall constitute a quorum for a Club meeting.

Article 9: MEETINGS

Section 1. No smoking is to be observed during an organized meeting.

Section 2. The annual meeting of the Club shall be held the regular meeting night of May of each year.

Section 3. Regular meetings shall be held a 7:00 PM on the first Tuesday of each month.

Section 4. Meeting location is subject to change and will be announced at a regular meeting.

Article 10: ORDER OF BUSINESS

Section 1. At all regular meetings of this Club the following order of business shall be followed, unless as a matter of expediency on occasion, the chair deems fit to depart there from:

- A. Welcome
- B. Introduction of Guests
- C. Reading of the Minutes of previous meeting
- D. Reading of Communications
- E. Action on Communications
- F. Applications for Membership
- G. Report of Officers
- H. Report of Committees
- I. Unfinished Business
- J. New Business
- K. Good of the Order
- L. Adjournment

Article 11: REMOVAL AND EXPULSION

Section 1. Any officer or member of the Club may be removed from office or expelled from membership upon a two-thirds vote of the membership present at a regular meeting. The membership shall be notified in writing of any proposed removal or expulsion thirty days in advance of the regular meeting at which such a vote is to be taken.

Section 2. Any member who is dropped from membership or is expelled shall lose all rights, privileges of the Club, and all interest in the Club property, if any, and in its activities.

Article 12: POWERS AND DUTIES OF OFFICERS

PRESIDENT

Section 1. The President shall enforce the rules and general provisions of the Club. He/she shall sign, together with the Secretary/Treasurer, on behalf of the Club, all contracts, bonds and other written instruments approved by the majority of members; shall see that the By-laws and rules and regulations made by majority of members present are rigidly enforced; shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as are in the By-laws especially provided or imposed by vote of membership in attendance at a regular meeting.

Section 2. The President shall appoint all none elective officers and committees.

VICE-PRESIDENT

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Vice-president to assist the President in the discharge of his/her duties, and in his/her absence to officiate in the President's stead

Section 2. In the event of a vacancy in the office of the President prior to the annual election of officers, the Vice-president shall succeed to that office.

SECRETARY/TREASURER

Section 1.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary/Treasurer:

- A. To keep a true record of the proceedings of all meetings of the Club, keeping the same in a comprehensive and legible form that shall be the permanent property of the Club.
- B. To keep and file all documents, records, reports and communications connected with the business of the Club.
- C. To notify members of their election, expulsion or suspension or the acceptance of their resignations.
- D. To notify each member of every special meeting called by the President and of the annual meeting.
- E. In case of inability to attend any meeting, to cause the necessary books and papers to be conveyed to the place of the meeting. The President shall appoint a member to take minutes of the meetings during the Secretary/Treasurers absence.
- F. The Secretary/Treasurer shall be allowed the necessary and proper disbursements for postage and stationery.
- G. Shall receive all monies paid to the Club from every source, and shall give receipts therefore, and shall deposit same in the bank or banks or other financial institutions approved by the membership and only in the name of the RAKERS Car Club.
- H. To conduct the financial relations of the Club and shall perform the other duties usually incumbent upon the office. He/she shall keep suitable books of accounts and shall disburse funds as directed by the membership.
- I. Shall make a report at each regular meeting showing the receipts and disbursements since the previous report. At the annual meeting he/she shall make a full and complete statement of the financial condition of the Club at the close of that year.
- J. Secretary/Treasurer's books shall be audited each year by a committee appointed by the Club President. Yearly treasurers report to be made at the annual meeting in May of each year.

Article 13:

COMMITTEES

Section 1.

Committees shall be appointed as needed by the President.

Article 14:

UNIFORM

Section 1.

The Club jacket shall be black with approved "RAKERS" logo on the back.

Section 2.

The Club T-shirts shirts will be white, gray or black in color with the approved "RAKERS" logo.

Section 3. "RAKERS" wearing apparel, vehicle display plaques or decals shall not be worn nor displayed by non- members of the RAKERS Car Club.

Article 15: AMENDMENTS

These By-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting, after prior written notice to the full membership.

Article 16: ADOPTION

These By-laws passed by a two-thirds vote of the members present at a regular meeting of the Club on August 7, 2001.
September 3, 2001 – addendum article 5, section 4
